

Dear parents / guardians,

Good news! Cylch Meithrin Pentreuchaf will re-open after the lockdown on Monday, September 21st between 1:30 - 3.30 in the afternoon.

The Cylch has a Covid19 policy in place to ensure the safety of all children and staff members. Staff will adhere to the social distancing regulations and thorough cleaning will take place during and especially after each session. Each child will receive a box of their own resources, such as art and crafts etc.

We kindly ask that you provide your child with their own fruit and water, and where possible provide fruit that your child can open / eat independently, so that staff do not have to assist, thereby reducing unnecessary contact.

Children will need to wear suitable clothes for going out to play - as many sessions will take place outdoors wherever possible.

In accordance with social distancing rules, parents will not be allowed into the Cylch building and 2m circles have been marked outside the Cylch door when collecting or dropping off the children. We kindly ask you to follow these rules please.

After some discussion we have come to the conclusion that the school may be able to offer a 'Meithrin Mwy' provision for children who already attend the Nursery class in the mornings. This means that they would stay in school after finishing the Nursery class at 11am, have a play session at 'Meithrin Mwy', eat their lunch at school and then attend the Cylch Meithrin in the afternoon as usual. There will be no need to go home between the two sessions, therefore greatly assisting with childcare and so on. You will also be able order school dinner for the children if you wish.

The 'Meithrin Mwy' provision is entirely dependent on the demand for the service therefore we would be very grateful if you could respond to this so that we can see if there is a demand before offering the service. Please email the headteacher to reply helenvaughanjones@gwynedd.llyw.cymruz
